




Daily reading and writing activities in Year 2 allow children to practise using suffixes and common word endings.

LET'S HAVE A LOOK A LITTLE CLOSER...



- Reception and KS1 will be teaching this daily
- Some children that need further revision or support may be receiving intervention during the day as well.
- In KS2 staff and children will be using the intervention resources to teach the children with gaps. They will also be using the support materials in class.
- All phonics displays and resources need to be using the Anima Phonics scheme in order to ensure continuity and consistency
- All lessons will take a similar structure so children know what to expect of them
- All children will be assessed initially using their assessment resources to work out where to start








- · Initially, the books children read from are fully decodable.
- This means they must be composed almost entirely of words made up of sounds that a child has learned up to that point.
- The children will be coming home with an anima phonics book when appropriate. This book will focus on a sound the children are learning or a sound that they have previously learned.





As the children in Reception and Year 1 learn sounds, there are these sheets that may come home for you to practise.



The children in KS1 will also take a book home as a shared book.

How to read a Shared Book?

- The other book that they come home with will be a shared book.
- The children may want to attempt to read some of the words in these books
 using the skills they are developing but we would not expect them to be able to
 read without support.
- You may wish to use this book as a bedtime story, or ask the children to listen to you read the book and then retell the story using the pictures.
- Some children learn to read without using their phonics. Please let us know in the reading diaries how you feel they are getting on.
