Science

Topic

PSHE (Monday)

This week the children will learn to differentiate between the terms risk, danger and hazard.

Activity: Children are to make a list of potential hazards at home, school and in the local area and explain why they could be dangerous.

Key vocabulary:

Risk - possible consequences and likelihood of something occurring

Danger - somebody or something which may cause harm

Hazard - Possible source of harm

It would be helpful if the children could talk through their ideas with an adult as they are filling in their sheet.

History:

What did the Romans believe?

In this lesson we will learn about the religious beliefs of the Romans. We will begin by looking at the similarities and differences between the Romans and the Celts. We will then find out what the Imperial Cult was and finally look at the fascinating story of how Christianity spread across Roman England. https://classroom.thenational.academy/lessons/what-did-the-romans-believe-60tp2r

French:

Counting to 12 and saying your age
