



# Class 2's Newsletter - Autumn 2021

## Dear Parents/Carers

Welcome to Class 2! I hope that you had a wonderful Summer Break. I am looking forward to the new challenges that Year 2 has to offer your child and we have a brilliant year planned. This newsletter is to inform you about what your child will be learning and taking part in this term in Year 2.

## Topic

Our topic for this term is Street Detectives. We shall be exploring Armitage and finding out what it is like today and also what it was like in the past. Some of the areas we shall be covering are making a model village, identifying important people in our community, learning about Lichfield, thinking of ways we can improve our local area, replicating the work of James Rizzi and learning about our school in the past. We will also be sending home a questionnaire for you to complete about people who live in our area who are famous or work hard to support our village. If you have any interesting information or books that we could borrow to help us learn more, we would love to borrow them. During French lessons we will be learning the names of different types of transport and we will begin to put these words and phrases into a sentence. As part of the computing curriculum, the children will learn how to stay safe online, how to search effectively and how to use spreadsheets. In RE lessons, we will be discussing how to care for the natural world and we will learn about the birth of Jesus. We will continue Rock-it music sessions with Mrs Baugh and we will also be looking at Peter and the Wolf by the composer Sergei Prokofiev and learning some modern Christmas songs using a new scheme called Charanga.

## Literacy

This term we are very excited to be launching a new writing scheme called 'The Write Stuff'. The children will be using two main texts and a video. The Owl Who Was Afraid of the Dark by Jill Tomlinson, Winter Sleep: A Hibernation Story by Sean Taylor and Alex Morss and the 2017 BBC One Christmas Advert - Talent Show Dancing. Therefore, the children will explore a mixture of fiction and non-fiction to help develop their literacy skills including reading, writing, spelling and handwriting. At the end of each block of work on each text or video the children will use the skills that they have learnt to write a variety of texts including an adventure story, a fact file and a story based on real life events. In the build up to these writing opportunities we will be focussing on the basic skills of writing including full stops, capital letters, word spaces, commas, use of adjectives, verbs, conjunctions (such as and, but and so) similes and onomatopoeia. When reading different texts, we will be skimming and scanning the text to locate the answers to questions and give opinions on the texts that we are reading. During Handwriting lessons, the children will be starting to learn how to join their letters. Initially, the children will begin to use the joins that they learn during wider writing opportunities so please support them to do this at home as well. The neatness and accuracy of their joining

will develop and improve over the year. In order to teach the children how to spell, they will be coming home with a mixture of spellings linked to our phonics, spelling teaching and common exception words (words that we are unable to 'sound out.')

Please help the children to learn these at home as they will be tested on them in school. More details about spelling will follow with the first set of spellings which the children will receive once they have settled in. In phonics, the school currently follows the letters and sounds phonics scheme. The children will be revising phase 5 and beginning phase 6. If your child needs to work on earlier phases then we will be continuing this work with them as well.

## **Numeracy**

Over this term, the children will be working with numbers to 100 and beyond. The children will learn how to read, write, order, add and subtract using these numbers. When adding and subtracting, the children will learn how to do so using the traditional vertical method. During mental maths, the children will be encouraged to improve the speed of their mental calculations with a particular focus on addition to 20 or 100 and the multiplication facts of the 10, 2 and 5 times tables. Any support learning these facts at home would be very beneficial. Also, lessons will include learning how to calculate multiplication and division using arrays and repeated addition. There will be a large focus this year on using these skills in order to solve problems and to verbally explain their answers or ideas on how to find a solution. A little later on in the term, we will be learning the value of coins and notes, finding equivalent ways to make that value including calculating change and converting pounds and pence.

## **Science**

This half term the children will be exploring the properties of materials and what they are used for. They will distinguish between natural and man-made materials and explore how materials can be changed by twisting, squeezing, squashing etc. We will be comparing materials used for a similar job and explaining our own ideas and observations using more scientific vocabulary. When planning and completing experiments, the children will be making predictions, recording results in a table and explaining what they have found out. I would also like the children to begin offering their own ideas on how to investigate and work together in a group in order to complete experiments.

## **PE**

The children will now have two PE lessons which will include a team games skills session with Miss Cole from Progressive Sports and a teacher run gymnastics lesson. We shall be having our PE lessons on Wednesdays and Fridays. The children need to come dressed appropriately for these lessons. They will need to wear a pair of black tracksuit bottoms or leggings, trainers, a plain white t-shirt and a school jumper. Could you also please make sure that if your child wears earrings that they are removed for these lessons, or that they can remove them themselves, otherwise they will not be able to take part in the lessons.

## **Homework and Reading**

Each Friday the children will be given a piece of Numeracy or Literacy homework which will be due in on a Tuesday. Please support your child and encourage them to complete their homework as it helps children practise and apply skills they have learned in school. If for any reason you and your child can not complete the homework on time, then do not hesitate to come and see me. We will read with the children at least once throughout the week so they will need to bring in their reading book on a daily basis. Please put a comment in their reading record book after you have listened to them read noting how they got on, words that they struggled with and any discussions the book may have instigated. Please ensure that the children have their books in school everyday as we often have extra reading sessions.

## **Reminder**

The children will need to bring in a named water bottle every day. This needs to water rather than squash or flavoured water please.

The door to the playground will be kept locked until the bell has gone in the morning as we are concerned about the safety of the children if left unsupervised. Please ensure that you wait with the children on the playground until the whistle is blown and then make sure that they line up in the correct line on the playground ready for me to collect them and take them inside. If it is raining, please bring the children to the door and the staff will escort the children to the classroom.

If the children would like toast in the morning break, please send the money in for the term with your child in a named envelope. Toast money for this half term will be £7.40. If the children would like to bring in their own break, we ask that this could be as healthy as possible to help the children learn effectively in the morning. The children will be offered a piece of fruit in the afternoon however, this is the only snack they are allowed at this time.
