In this lesson, we will be learning about the differences between invertebrates and vertebrates. All animals can be classified as either invertebrates which do not have a backbone or vertebrates which have a backbone. We will be identifying different animals from these classifications.

In this lesson you will:

Apply knowledge of phonics to identify rhyming words, create a character in the style of Michael Rosen's Bendy Man, use noun phrases to label and describe their creation, write a poem using the same rhyming structure as Michael Rosen's 'Oh Dear!'

In this lesson you will use adjectives to create noun phrases when describing invented animals, explore, decide and explain what their dream job would be using 'because' to join ideas, investigate how to make a word plural by adding 's' or 'es'.

Activity 1 - watch the video of me reading the story on Purple Mash and there is also the option of watching a video of the story which may show the pages in more detail.


