Links to the wider community and Extra-curricular provision

The school has strong links with the local Church and the school attend whole community events at Church such as the Christmas Carol concert and the Christmas tree festival.

The Rector leads termly assemblies and the children visit the local Church as part of their lessons when learning about Christianity.

They have contributed to displays in the village and Staffordshire, for example the Christmas tree festival in the local church and the shop window displays in Lichfield. Links to whole school improvement
