Mathematics:

Mathematics lessons will continue to use the White Rose links This week the focus will be on multiplying and dividing by 10 and 100. Tuesday through to Friday will have a linked video clip and a worksheet to complete.

Writing:

The focus of this week's writing lessons will be on the build up of skills that will help to construct a set of instructions on 'How To Care For Your Dragon' unit. Oak National Academy is delivered by practicing teachers who have been employed by the Government. It is a recommended site designed to support schools in the remote learning.

Reading:

I have set you the final chapters of your new book, either 'The Great Marvello' or 'Lucinda Leap and the Hedgehog Gang' or ' ' depending on your reading level, followed by the accompanying multiple choice and associated questions in Purple Mash. Topic / Art

In Medieval times, all books were hand written and decorated by hand, usually by priests and monks. They were seen as very precious works of art, and you had to be very skilled to produce them.


Spelling activities to complete throughout the week
