Why we teach MFL

MFL is an important part of primary education for many reasons. At The Croft we recognise that MFL can help develop a child's self-confidence, both in their learning and themselves. MFL can enrich and enhance a child's mental development, as studies have shown that learning a foreign language increases critical thinking skills, creativity and flexibility of a child's mind. MFL can improve a child's understanding of the English language. At The Croft it is important to us that we encourage positive attitudes towards foreign languages and the people who speak them, through the teaching of MFL and broaden children's horizons.

Curricular provision

At The Croft we provide MFL lessons for Key Stage 1, although this is not compulsory subject in the National Curriculum.

We provide taster sessions of German & Spanish for Year 6 pupils in the last half of the summer term in readiness for Secondary School.

Year 4 are taught Latin linked to their topic of The Romans for 1 term.

Year 6 G&T are invited to a MFL morning at The Friary.

The MFL Curriculum At The Croft
At The Croft MFL lessons are taught by
either the MFL co-ordinator in Key Stage 2
or the class teacher in Key Stage 1 and EYFS.
Each class has 1 session of quality MFL per
week where pupils learn or practise new
vocabulary either orally or written.
Children explore the patterns of sounds of
language through listening to phrases,
sentences, stories and poems.
Children have the opportunity to listen to and
read stories, songs, poems and rhymes.
