MATHS -
This week we are moving on to division. The main focus in Year 3 is mental division, and they do not need to learn the bus stop method. The videos encourage the children to use the number facts that they already know and apply these to division. Many of the lessons use bar models, part-part whole frames and place value charts which the children are familiar with.


ICT - SAFER INTERNET DAY - TUESDAY 9th FEBRUARY

Key Learning: To locate the Artic Tundra on a world map

Watch the video and pause it at the point where it shows where the Tundra is. Go back to your earlier world map and label on the Tundra - don't forget to include a key.

A blank world map has been added onto Purple Mash in case you want to keep it separate.

TOPIC - Predators of the Artic Tundra.

I would like you to select one of the predators below, and create an information sheet about them. Consider what they eat and how they are adapted to their habitat. You can choose how to present your work, or you can use the writing frame on Purple Mash.

Predators of the Artic Tundra:

- Artic fox

- Snowy owl
- Musk ox
- Polar bear
- Artic hare

CHINESE NEW YEAR!

Watch the Powerpoint to find out how each of the animals were given a year. Select one of the animals and make a mask to represent it. You may decide to do this year, the year of the Ox, or your birth year, you can decide.

If you want to you can print, colour and cut the mask on Purple mask to create a decorative Chinese dragon.

Extension - print out the dragon fortune teller and make an dragon that can nibble fingers!

Each step = 1 point so each complete circuit is 8 points and then for example if time finished when you are on the 5th step you would get an extra 5 points.
