

Class Book:

I would love to create our own class book. The children can then look at each others' ideas when they come back to school.

Choose an animal and choose a form of transport. Can you write your own silly page. Don't worry about making it rhyme (unless you can) - can you record your own sentences to explain why you can't take this animal on this form of transport. Be as silly as you would like!

Make a mask:

Although we aren't dressing up - lets make some masks to help us get in character. Can you make an animal mask to get in character?

You could use some card, paper or paper plate. You could paint, colour or decorate in different ways.

Rhyming Words:

There are lots of rhyming words in the poem. Listen to the story again. Can you find the rhyming pairs? You could write these down on your own or find the pairs on the sheet I have uploaded onto Purple Mash.

Role Play:

Use a sofa, cushions, chairs a bed (or whatever you have) to make a pretend bus. If you have cuddly animals - can you put them on the bus then think of reasons why they can't go on the bus. Take some pictures and send them in!

Traffic Survey:

In this story, each animal is seen on a different form of transport. On one of your walks, take a traffic survey. Which vehicles did you see the most of? Which is the most and least popular?

Please don't feel like you have to do all of these activities, I have put a variety of types of activities so that you can make this work for you. I can't wait to see what you get up to ...
